The Economic Development Office (EDO) provides some services to businesses directly, and also works alongside other Council services and with local partners that provide support and advice for businesses. We identify business related opportunities and lobby for improvements in business-related policy at both a local and regional level.

Aims and Objectives

- To encourage a viable and prosperous economy in Wandsworth, particularly with respect to small enterprises
- To make local town centres prosperous and attractive by supporting local businesses, improving premises and making environmental improvements
- To work with key partners to foster neighbourhood renewal in priority areas of the Borough
- To address “worklessness” in deprived parts of the Borough and with particular groups, such as unemployed young black males of Caribbean origin
- To build a cohesive community in Wandsworth, encouraging volunteering by promoting the benefits for individuals and host organisations
- By working with the voluntary and community sector, to help provide better services and information for Wandsworth residents.

The role of the Economic Development Office

- To be the voice for business within the Council, within and outside the Borough
- To provide a strategic framework for many other Council and Government services
- To work with all Council departments to improve services for Wandsworth businesses, both large and small
- To ensure value for money through effective procurement and contract monitoring
- To lead many of the Council's bids for Government and other grant funding
- To provide input to promote economic, social and environmental well-being within Wandsworth.

- **Improving deprived areas** such as Nine Elms, Battersea, Tooting and Roehampton, through regeneration projects and by attracting new sources of investment.
- **Supporting private sector-led partnerships** and promoting initiatives and schemes that will ensure our five town centres remain busy and attractive locations in which to live and work.
- **Helping businesses to win contracts** – to enable businesses to play a role in the Borough's major developments, such as at Battersea Power Station, but also for 2012 opportunities and other major developments. - **Encouraging the development of business space.** We work with developers and other relevant organisations to bring forward more business space and renew our older industrial areas.

- **Organising regular networking and events**, such as the Wandsworth Business Forum meetings. These events take place in local venues throughout the Borough at least 3 times each year. Keynote speakers are invited to present a variety of business topics and guests are encouraged to talk to other entrepreneurs. The Forum is also supported by Wandsworth Chamber of Commerce and sponsored by Liberata.
- **Promoting Wandsworth as a great place in which to live and work**, organising and participating in inward investment events and attending exhibitions and events across the region.

Improving Our Town Centres

Town Centre Improvement Scheme

This Scheme provides loans and grants to businesses to refurbish and improve their premises. It is designed to make a difference to the business and add value to the property as well as improving the immediate local area. Improvements should have a life expectancy of 5 years.

Typically, the Scheme provides interest free loans and/or grants of up to 33.3% of eligible costs from a minimum of £1,000 to maximum of £15,000 per eligible address. The following are examples of works eligible for support:

- Restoring or replacing shop fronts in a style appropriate to the building as well as external works to the front of the building, e.g.; brick cleaning, re-pointing
- Bringing vacant or underused basement or upper floors back into use; structural, internal works to increase or enhance the business and/or the commercial space
- Providing access for people with disabilities
- Investment in fixtures/fittings as part of a redevelopment project
- Internal renovations including rewiring, new lighting, new plumbing, new floors and ceilings etc.
- Creation of separate access to flat above
- The Council will assess at 50% any part of a project which has a GREEN environmental benefit
- Environmental and other local improvements such as signs and hanging baskets that can improve the area for the benefit of local businesses
- Meeting legal or professional fees incurred in planning any of the above.

Applications are subject to individual assessment and all financial assistance is discretionary. We will process all applications within 28 days.

Eligible Areas

The Scheme focuses on the five town centres of Balham, Clapham Junction, Putney, Tooting and Wandsworth and also parts of East Battersea, the Mitcham Lane area, Roehampton and Tooting Bec. The Council can consider higher levels of support in exceptional circumstances for business premises in 1-59 Danebury Avenue, Roehampton.

Town Centre Management

In order to sustain the vitality and viability of the Borough's town centres, the Council and its partners have developed business plans for each town centre based on the following principles:

- Establishing a shared vision for Wandsworth's town centres
- Promoting and developing the Borough by creating an attractive sustainable environment, effective infrastructure and a positive climate for long term private sector investment
- Managing the Borough's amenities so that there is a safe and clean environment with good access for all
- Involving and communicating with residents, businesses, investors, employees and partners to create a quality experience
- Enabling local people and businesses to benefit from the development and improvement of the Borough
- Creating partnerships with a range of Council services (including Economic Development, Technical Services, Housing, Crime Prevention, Leisure and Amenity Services), businesses, residents, the community and other public and independent sector agencies.

Specific policies and actions vary from town centre to town centre, but generally include:

- Promoting each town centre to the resident catchment area and as a place for businesses to invest in
- Working with other Council services to ensure continuous improvement in the appropriate services, e.g. refuse, recycling, traffic, parking, planning, crime and safety, street markets, information and advice
- Lobbying and liaising with other agencies (Transport for London - TfL, the Police, etc.) to ensure there is a strong voice to speak out for town centre interests
- Acting as the voice of the Council in each town centre and within the Council – an extension of the overall Economic Development Office's role as the voice for business
- Helping to develop small independent businesses in the town centres so that they can be more competitive and offer better goods and services to residents.

Improving Older Industrial Areas

Business Improvement Scheme

This is a loan and grant scheme to promote private investment in 3 older industrial areas; Garratt Business Park and Stewarts Road, Battersea and New Covent Garden Market - see below for area definitions. Support will be up to 33.3% of eligible expenditure from a minimum support level of to a maximum of £20,000. Applications will be considered on a first come first served basis and the scheme aims to:

- Help create more business space through redevelopment and conversion opportunities and so help individual businesses to expand and create more jobs
- To assist the development of business networks to improve the area
- To promote improvement to the environment, infrastructure, access, parking and security under the Business Improvement Scheme support can be considered for the following:
 - Improvements to business premises including conversions and extensions, security measures, access and environmental improvements
 - Similar works for groups of businesses which bring a wider benefit to the estates as a whole
 - Purchase of new equipment
 - Marketing, product development and consultancy studies
- The Council will assess at 50% any part of a project which has a GREEN environmental benefit.

Battersea Power Station

The site was acquired by REO/Treasury Holdings, in late 2006. REO and the Council will work together to ensure that local people and local businesses benefit from the development. The primary means of delivering this objective will be through the Job Shop - Employment and Business Opportunities. The aim of the Job Shop is to become a physical hub from which local people are able to compete for, and gain employment arising from this development.

Roehampton

The Roehampton Regeneration Framework, containing 43 projects costing about £33m, is being implemented. It aims to improve the look and feel of the Roehampton area; to make Roehampton safer; to integrate and link usage and access to facilities; to improve access to the area; and to maximise its ability to generate and sustain economic activity and trade, in consultation with local residents.

The Roehampton Regeneration Framework is overseen by the Roehampton Partnership, which consists of representatives from the Council, the Police, Health Services, Education, businesses, local residents and voluntary and community groups. The Partnership has agreed an implementation plan of initiatives which will lead to the regeneration of Roehampton over the next 5 to 10 years.

The largest project is the creation of a new centre for Roehampton that is focused on 5 sites;

- Site A: Recreation Centre – now extended and reopened as the Roehampton Sport & Fitness Centre
- Site B: Boys Club
- Site C: The Co-op block
- Site D: Danebury Avenue Shops
- Site E: Allbrook House/Library
